A watercolor workshop, a “Third Angle” concert with dinner, a Family Day and an Oral History Evening comprise the fourth annual Yale Valley Arts Festival. The festival takes place July 27th through July 30th, 2006, near Cougar, Washington.

Surrounded by the steep forested foothills of Mt. St. Helens, the lush Yale Valley has inspired works by leading regional artists. Intimate streams and lakes formed by reservoirs on the North Fork of the Lewis River are part of the landscape.

John Stahl teaches a watercolor workshop inspired by the beauty of the Yale Valley, Thursday and Friday, July 27th and July 28th, 9-12 AM and 1-4 PM, \$30 for half a day, or \$50 for a full day.

Concert goers will experience composers of our time performed by Third Angle on classical instruments. A view of the Yale Valley can be seen from the venue, Anderson Lodge Hilltop House. Call early for reservations. Only 100 tickets will be available. The cost is \$38 for the concert and dinner, Sunday July 30th at 4:30 pm.

Children’s creativity will be stimulated by experienced art teachers, “Reach for the Stars” dancers, Lelooska Foundation performers and young musicians. Family Day takes place Saturday, July 29th at Yale School (11842 Lewis River Rd.), from 1 to 4 PM. Children must be accompanied by an adult. Free.

Early residents of the Lewis River area will share memories at the Oral History Evening, Thursday, July 27th, from 7 to 9 PM at Yale School. Free.
